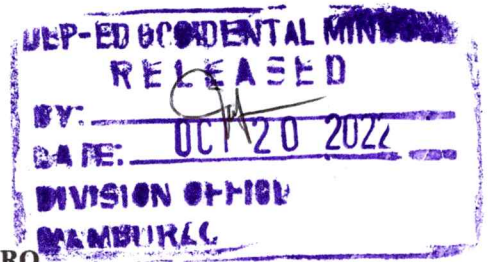

AMENDMENT TO DEPED ORDER 34, S. 2022

(School Calendar and Activities for the School Year 2022-2023)

1. Per DepEd Order No. 44, s. 2022 with the same title, the Schools Division of Occidental Mindoro announces the amendment made to DepEd Order No. 34, s. 2022 titled *School Calendar and Activities for School Year 2022-2023* as:

Item Nos 16 and 17 of DO34, s. 2022 are amended as:

16. Private schools may continue to implement any of the following options:

- a. 5 days of in-person classes;
- b. Blended Learning Modality:
 - b.1. three days of in-person classes and two days of distance learning (modular, online, or television/radio-based instruction); and thereafter, four days of in-person classes and one day of distance learning (modular, online, or television/radio-based instruction)
 - e.g. Mondays to Wednesdays - in-person classes, and Thursday to Fridays – distance learning
 - e.g. Mondays to Thursdays – in-person classes, and Fridays (distance learning)
- c. Full Distance Learning

17. Starting November 2, 2022, all public schools shall have transitioned to 5-day in-person classes. After the said date, no public school shall be allowed to implement purely distance learning or blended learning, except for those that are expressly provided an exemption by the Regional Director, those classes are automatically cancelled due to disaster and calamities, and those implementing Alternative Delivery Modes, as provided for in DO 021, s. 2019, titled Policy Guidelines on the K to 12 Basic Education Program, and DO 001, s. 2022 titled Revised Policy Guidelines on Homeschooling Program. A separate department memorandum shall be issued relative to the exemption that will be provided by the Regional Director.

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2. All other provisions in DO 34, s. 2022 shall remain effective unless otherwise amended by other DepEd issuances.

3. Relative to this, the School Division of Occidental Mindoro through the School Management Monitoring and Evaluation (SMME) Section, SGOD shall conduct survey on the modality/modalities to be implemented, or to be continuously implemented by November 2. Likewise, it is expected that transition shall be observed, at least before the end of the School Year. As such, the survey shall also ask the duration of every learning delivery modality that shall be implemented by the school.

4. Wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

(School Calendar and Activities for the School Year 2022–2023)

1. The Department of Education (DepEd) issues the **Amendment to DepEd Order (DO) 034, s. 2022**, titled **School Calendar and Activities for the School Year 2022–2023**.

2. Item Nos. 16 and 17 of DO 034, s. 2022 are amended as follows:

16. Private schools may continue to implement any of the following options:

a. 5 days of in-person classes;

b. Blended learning modality:

b.1 three days of in-person classes and two days of distance learning (modular, online, or television/radio-based instruction); and thereafter, four days of in-person classes and one day of distance learning (modular, online, or television/radio-based instruction)

e.g., Mondays to Wednesdays (in-person classes) and Thursdays to Fridays (distance learning).

e.g., Mondays to Thursdays (in-person classes) and Fridays (distance learning).

c. Full Distance Learning

17. Starting November 2, 2022, all public schools shall have transitioned to 5-days in-person classes. After the said date, no public school shall be allowed to implement purely distance learning or blended learning, except for those that are expressly provided an exemption by the Regional Director, those whose classes are automatically cancelled due to disaster and calamities, and those implementing Alternative Delivery Modes, as provided for in DO 021, s. 2019, titled **Policy Guidelines on the K to 12 Basic Education Program** and DO 001, s. 2022 titled **Revised Policy Guidelines on Homeschooling Program**. A separate department memorandum shall be issued relative to the exemption that will be provided by the Regional Director.

3. All other provisions stated in DO 034, s. 2022 shall remain effective unless otherwise amended by other DepEd issuances.
4. This DepEd Order is approved and shall take effect upon its publication in DepEd website: www.deped.gov.ph.
5. Immediate dissemination of and strict compliance with this Order is directed.
